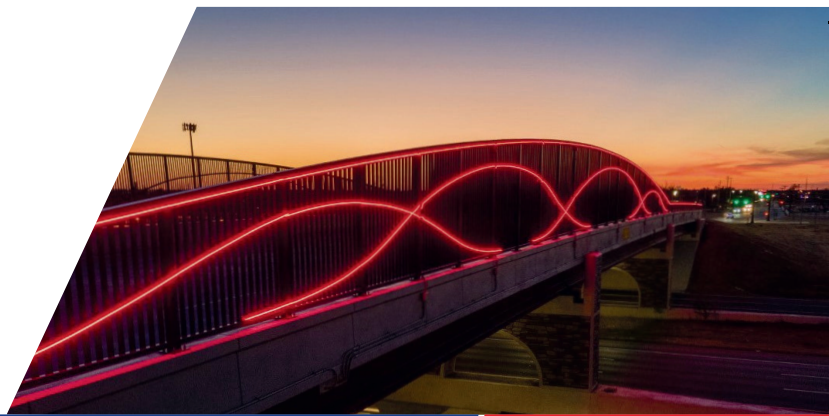

## From the Moore Fire Department

In Oklahoma we are well accustomed to inclement weather and the resulting power outages. Many of us have equipped ourselves to deal with this harsh reality by purchasing generators for our homes to cover the gap. Again, these are wonderful tools when used responsibly.



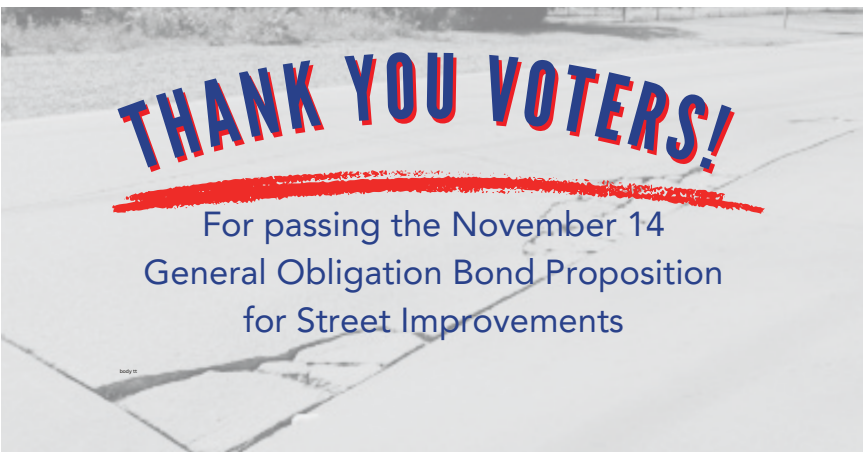
- We recommend that prior to using a generator you first install a carbon monoxide detector to help notify your family of any potential threat. These can be purchased at most hardware or grocery stores.
- It is important that generators be vented properly to ensure that poisonous carbon monoxide gas does not build up to dangerous levels. Your generator should be placed outside of the structure of your residence and never placed under porches or in garages.
- If you start to develop carbon monoxide poisoning symptoms (headache, dizziness, nausea, etc.) you should evacuate the residence and call 9-1-1.

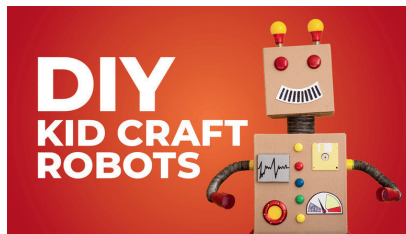
