



Moore Farm Market Back for Year Two

More than 20 farmers and ranchers make up the backbone of this farmers' market. Moore Farm Market is a partnership between the City of Moore and Cleveland County.

This alliance provides strong support for our local and regional food supply by giving farmers an outlet for their locally grown and harvested products.

Managed by the Cleveland County Farm Market Manager, the Moore Farm Market at Central Park opened in May 2024 after being dormant for a few years. The 2024 season saw thousands of people visit the market with an average of 40 vendors each Saturday. We expect 2025 to be even busier with vendor interest at an all-time high.





In addition to farm-fresh produce, free-range eggs and pasture-raised meats, the market offers local honey, bedding plants, home-baked goods including sourdough breads, hand-poured candles, dog treats, bath and body products and artisan craft items.

Operating Saturdays from 8 a.m. to Noon, the market is being hosted at Central Park's Multipurpose Pavilion, 700 S Broadway Ave., in Moore. The 2025 season runs May 3 through September 20.
